She is an external member of the board of examiners at the University of Madras, Chepauk, Chennai. She is also a member on

the Advisory Board (IAB) for *Horizon Journal of Humanities & Social Sciences Research* (JHSSR) since 2022. and a member of the *American Comparative Literary Association* (ACLA) since 2020.

Her research is interdisciplinary, combining studies in the fields of literary translingualism and linguistics. She has participated in various international conferences and workshops where she has discussed research methodologies. She has also discussed the significance of the term translingual in literature and contact studies, digital translingual platforms and art, women's contemporary translingual writing and talked about politics and narratives of the body in post-colonial contexts.
