## **Samples of Biographical Statement**

Once articles have been selected and accepted for publication, authors will be asked to submit a biographical statement to be included in the manuscript to be published by JHSSR. The biographical statement should include the author(s) <u>full name</u>. In addition, it is also appropriate to discuss your **personal history, academic program and/or field placement, and interest in the article's subject**.

The biographical statement **may not exceed 90 words**. Below is an example taken from our resources:
